#### Sienna R. Craig

Sienna R. Craig is the Orvil Dryfoos Professor of Public Affairs in the Department of Anthropology at Dartmouth College. She received her PhD in cultural anthropology from Cornell University (2006). Craig is the author of publications on many topics ranging from high Himalayan “horse culture” to bio-political investigations of Tibetan medicine.

Her most recent book, *The Ends of Kinship: Connecting Himalayan Lives Between Nepal and New York* (University of Washington Press, 2020) draws upon over two decades of ethnographic fieldwork to explore cycles of migration and familial connection between New York City and the Mustang region of Nepal. Craig enjoys writing across genres and has published poetry, creative nonfiction, fiction, and children’s literature in addition to scholarly works in medical and cultural anthropology.
